



## **EXTERNAL PRIVACY POLICY**

NAL Resources Management Limited ("NAL") provides management services to NAL Resources Limited, other affiliates and to third parties companies managed by NAL or affiliates under any administrative or cost sharing agreement to whom NAL provides services or support ("NAL group"). At NAL and members of the NAL group we are committed to maintaining the accuracy, confidentiality and security of your personal information. This Privacy Policy describes the personal information that NAL collects from or about you, how we use and to whom we disclose that information. We include provisions in this policy that include information on what personal information we may collect from your use of our website and how we use and disclose that information, as applicable.

NAL has adopted several Privacy Policies in order to address the specific privacy concerns of certain groupings of individuals. This Privacy Policy applies to the personal information of all individuals, unless the personal information is related to an individual who seeks to be, is or was employed by NAL. Such information is dealt with in the "NAL Privacy Policy" specifically for Employees and Contractors.

If you are unsure of which Privacy Policy applies to you, please contact our Privacy Officer for more information.

### **Privacy Policy Effective for Canada**

It is NAL's policy to comply with the privacy legislation within each jurisdiction in which we operate. Sometimes the privacy legislation and / or an individual's right to privacy are different from one jurisdiction to another. This Privacy Policy covers only those activities that are subject to the provisions of Canada's federal and provincial privacy laws, as applicable.

This Privacy Policy has a limited scope and application. Consequently, the rights and obligations contained in this Privacy Policy may not be available to all individuals or in all jurisdictions. If you are unsure if or how this Privacy Policy applies to you, please contact our Privacy Officer for more information.

### **What is Personal Information?**

For the purposes of this Privacy Policy, personal information is any information about an identifiable individual, other than the person's business title or business contact information when used or disclosed for the purpose of business communications.

### **What Personal Information do we Collect?**

We collect and maintain different types of personal information in respect of the individuals with whom we interact. This includes:

- contact and identification information, such as your name, address, telephone number and e-mail address;
- product and service related information concerning the products and services that we provide to, or receive from, you or programs that we offer;



- for parties with whom we do business, credit and financial information such as your payment methods and preferences, and billing and credit history, where applicable; and
- business relationship information, including information related to your agreements, preferences, advisors and decision-makers, feed-back and information requested by or provided to you.

In addition, we may collect the personal information that you submit to our website, such as your name, address and any other contact or other information that you choose to provide by:

- using the "contact us" portion of this website;
- applying for a position or a program with NAL through our website;
- by corresponding with a representative of NAL via e-mail using the hyperlinks created for that purpose.

Where you request information from us, we may use the e-mail address that you provide to send you information about offers on programs, products and services that we believe may be of interest to you.

We may also collect market-related information, which may include personal information, concerning market trends and activities impacting our business. This information may include contract terms, financial information and other information for the purpose of market analysis and strategic planning. We may also collect information related to our media, investor and public relations activities and information related to our interactions with financial and other analysts and advisors.

As a general rule, NAL collects personal information directly from you. In most circumstances where the personal information that we collect about you is held by a third party, we will obtain your permission before we seek out this information from such sources (such permission may be given directly by you, or implied from your actions).

From time to time, we may utilize the services of third parties in our business and may also receive personal information collected by those third parties in the course of the performance of their services for us or otherwise. Where this is the case, we will take reasonable steps to ensure that such third parties have represented to us that they have the right to disclose your personal information to us.

Where permitted or required by applicable law or regulatory requirements, we may collect information about you without your knowledge or consent.

### **Why Do We Collect Personal Information?**

NAL collects personal information to enable us to manage, maintain, and develop our business and operations, including:

- to establish, maintain and manage our relationship with you so that we may provide you with, or receive from you, the programs, products and services that have been requested (for example, as applicable, we will use your

personal information to establish your identity and location so that we may pay you the rents or royalties due in respect of a lease that you have granted to us);

- to provide management and related services to members of the NAL group;
- where you have requested credit, to confirm your financial situation, obtain a credit check and determine your initial and ongoing eligibility for credit and, where credit is granted, to administer and manage our credit relationship with you;
- where you use one of our password protected portals to be able establish, maintain and manage that account and to provide you with suitable information on the applicable portal;
- to be able to review the products and services that we provide to you so that we may understand your requirements for our programs, products and services and so that we may work to improve our products and services;
- to be able to review the products and services that we obtain from you so that we may work with you and so that you may understand our requirements for such products and services;
- to administer or otherwise carry out our obligations in relation to any agreement you have with us;
- to be able to comply with your requests (for example, if you prefer to be contacted at a business or residential telephone number and advise us of your preference, we will use this information to contact you at that number);
- to be able to establish, manage and terminate our leases of mineral or surface rights;
- to perform our business and operations including record keeping or internal reporting functions;
- to protect us against error, breach of contract, negligence, fraud, theft, illegal activity and damage to our goods and property;
- to enable us to undertake our environmental, health and safety activities, including incident planning, response and investigation;
- to enable us to comply with applicable law or regulatory requirements (for example, we may collect personal information to satisfy the obligations imposed on us by various regulatory boards or agencies to follow procedures mandated by such boards or agencies in respect of the provision of our products and services); and
- any other reasonable purpose to which you consent.



## **Our Websites and Portals**

We use websites to share and collect information and specialized web based portals to provide information, programs, training or to facilitate transactions. We also collect certain information when you visit our website or portals. You can visit our website without telling us who you are or revealing any information about yourself, including your e-mail address. Our web server may collect information related to your visit to our website, including the IP address and domain used to access our website, the type and version of your browser, the website you came from to access our website, the page you entered and exited at, any website page that is viewed by that IP address and what country you are from. We use this information to monitor our website's performance (such as number of visits, average time spent, page views) and for our business purposes such as working to continually upgrade our website.

To visit our portals we collect personal information in order to verify your authority to use the portal, and to manage the information available to you, and to protect the security of the portal.

Our website may contain links to other websites that may be subject to less stringent privacy standards. We cannot assume any responsibility for the privacy practices, policies or actions of the third parties that operate these websites. NAL is not responsible for how such third parties collect, use or disclose your personal information. You should review the privacy policies of these websites before providing them with personal information.

## **How Do We Use Cookies?**

When you visit the website, we may place a "cookie" on the hard drive of your computer to track your visit. A cookie is a small data file that is transferred to your hard drive through your web browser that can only be read by the website that placed the cookie on your hard drive. The cookie acts as an identification card and allows our website to identify you and to record your passwords and preferences. The cookie allows us to track your visit to the website so that we can better understand your use of our website so that we can customize and tailor the website to better meet your needs.

Most web browsers are set to accept cookies. However, on most web browsers you may change this setting to have your web browser either: (1) notify you prior to a website placing a cookie on your hard drive so that you can decide whether or not to accept the cookie; or (2) automatically prevent the placing of a cookie on your hard drive. It should be noted that if cookies are not accepted, you may not be able to access some web pages found on the website.

## **How Do We Use and Disclose Your Personal Information?**

We may use and disclose your personal information:

- for the purposes described in this Privacy Policy; or
- for any additional purposes for which we have obtained your consent to the use or disclosure of your personal information.

Your personal information is shared with our employees, contractors, consultants, affiliates and other parties who require such information to assist us with establishing, maintaining and



managing our relationship with you. In addition, personal information may be disclosed or transferred to another party in the event of a change in ownership of, or a grant of a security interest in, all or a part of NAL or its business.

NAL uses the services of many contractors and consultants in our business. We may share personal information with such organizations where they require such information to permit us to conduct our activities. We may use contractual and other means to require such organizations to use such information only for the purposes of providing services to us and only under our instruction, and to act in a manner consistent with the relevant principles articulated in this Privacy Policy as well as applicable privacy law. For example, NAL and our other affiliates or service providers may provide certain information technology and data processing services to us from time to time so that we may operate our business.

NAL, service providers and other parties with whom we share information under this privacy policy, may perform activities outside of Canada. As a result, in such cases, your information may be securely used, stored or accessed in other countries and be subject to the laws of those countries. For example, information may be shared in response to valid demands or requests from government authorities, courts and law enforcement officials in those countries.

In addition, we may use certain cloud-based services to process or store information. Cloud-based services are software and hardware that are managed by third parties at remote locations, such as online file storage.

We may use or disclose your personal information without your knowledge or consent where we are permitted or required by applicable law or regulatory requirements to do so.

#### **When do we Disclose Your Personal Information?**

We may share your personal information with our employees, contractors, consultants and other parties who require such information to assist us with managing our relationship with you, including: third parties that provide services to us or on our behalf; third parties that assist NAL in the provision of services to you; and third parties whose services we use to conduct our business.

Where we are considering obtaining or granting or have obtained or granted an interest (such as through a partnership, joint venture or other commercial structure) in one or a series of wells, pipelines or other operations NAL may exchange personal information with members of the NAL group and / or third parties such as other resource companies, land agents, and land brokers in the conduct of that operation.

In addition, personal information may be disclosed or transferred to another party during the course of, or completion of, a change in ownership of or the grant of a security interest in, all or a part of NAL through, for example, an asset or share sale, or some other form of business combination, merger or joint venture, provided that such party is bound by appropriate agreements or obligations and required to use or disclose your personal information in a manner consistent with the use and disclosure provisions of this Privacy Policy, unless you consent otherwise.

Further, your personal information may be disclosed:

- as permitted or required by applicable law or regulatory requirements;



- to comply with valid legal processes such as search warrants, subpoenas or court orders;
- as part of NAL's regular reporting activities to [its parent and] members of the NAL group for whom we are providing management and other services;
- to protect the rights and property of NAL;
- during emergency situations or where necessary to protect the safety of a person or group of persons;
- where the personal information is publicly available; or
- with your consent.

In addition, personal information may be disclosed or transferred to another party (including to another member of the NAL group) in the event of a change in ownership of, or a grant of a security interest in, all or a part of NAL through, for an example, an asset or share sale, or some other form of business combination, merger or joint venture, provided that such party is bound by appropriate agreements or obligations and required to use or disclose your personal information in a manner consistent with the use and disclosure provisions of this Privacy Policy, unless you consent otherwise.

#### **Your Consent is Important to Us**

It is important to us that we collect, use or disclose your personal information where we have your consent to do so. Depending on the sensitivity of the personal information, your consent may be implied, deemed (using an opt-out mechanism) or express. Express consent can be given orally, electronically or in writing. Implied consent is consent that can reasonably be inferred from your action or inaction. For example, when you enter into an agreement with us, we will assume your consent to the collection, use and disclosure of your personal information for purposes related to the performance of that agreement and for any other purposes identified to you at the relevant time.

Typically, we will seek your consent at the time that we collect your personal information. In certain circumstances, your consent may be obtained after collection but prior to our use or disclosure of your personal information. If we plan to use or disclose your personal information for a purpose not previously identified (either in this Privacy Policy or separately), we will endeavor to advise you of that purpose before such use or disclosure.

As we have described above, we may collect, use or disclose your personal information without your knowledge or consent where we are permitted or required to do so by applicable law or regulatory requirements.

#### **Choice/Opt-Out**

You may change or withdraw your consent at any time, subject to legal or contractual restrictions and reasonable notice, by contacting our Privacy Officer using the contact information set out below. In some circumstances, a change in or withdrawal of consent may severely limit our ability to provide products or services to, or acquire products or services



from, you. All communications with respect to such withdrawal or variation of consent should be in writing and addressed to our Privacy Officer.

You may change or withdraw your consent at any time, subject to legal or contractual obligations and reasonable notice, by contacting our Privacy Officer using the contact information set out below. All communications with respect to such withdrawal or variation of consent should be in writing and addressed to our Privacy Officer.

We assume that, unless you advise us otherwise, that you have consented to the collection, use and disclosure of your personal information as explained in this Privacy Policy.

### **How is Your Personal Information Protected?**

NAL endeavors to maintain physical, technical and procedural safeguards that are appropriate to the sensitivity of the personal information in question. These safeguards are designed to seek to prevent your personal information from loss and unauthorized access, copying, use, modification or disclosure.

Unfortunately, no data transmission over the Internet can be guaranteed to be 100% secure. As a result, while our systems seek to protect your personal information, we cannot warrant the security of any information you transmit to us electronically, and you do so at your own risk. Once our website receives your transmission, we make commercially reasonable efforts to ensure its security on our systems.

The security of your personal information is important to us, please advise our Privacy Officer immediately of any incident involving the loss of or unauthorized access, use, modification or disclosure of personal information that is in our custody or control.

### **How Long is Your Personal Information Retained?**

Except as otherwise permitted or required by applicable law or regulatory requirements, NAL endeavors to retain your personal information only for as long as it believes is necessary to fulfill the purposes for which the personal information was collected (including, for the purpose of meeting any legal, record retention, accounting or other reporting requirements or obligations). We may, instead of destroying or erasing your personal information, make it anonymous such that it cannot be associated with or tracked back to you.

### **Updating Your Personal Information**

It is important that the information contained in our records is both accurate and current. If your personal information happens to change during the course of our relationship, please keep us informed of such changes.

In some circumstances, we may not agree with your request to change your personal information and will instead append an alternative text to the record in question.

### **Access to Your Personal Information**

You can ask to see your personal information. If you want to review, verify or correct your personal information, please contact our Privacy Officer. Please note that any such communication must be in writing.



When requesting access to your personal information, please note that we may request specific information from you to enable us to confirm your identity and right to access, as well as to search for and provide you with the personal information that we hold about you. We may charge you a fee to access your personal information; however, we will advise you of any fee in advance. If you require assistance in preparing your request, please contact the office of our Privacy Officer.

Your right to access the personal information that we hold about you is not absolute. There are instances where applicable law or regulatory requirements allow or require us to refuse to provide some or all the personal information that we hold about you. In addition, the personal information may have been destroyed, erased or made anonymous in accordance with our record retention obligations and practices.

In the event that we cannot provide you with access to your personal information, we will endeavor to inform you of the reasons why, subject to any legal or regulatory restrictions.

#### **Inquiries or Concerns?**

If you have any questions about this Privacy Policy or concerns about how we manage your personal information, please contact our Privacy Officer in writing or by e-mail. We will endeavor to answer your questions and advise you of any steps taken to address the issues raised by you. If you are dissatisfied with our response, you may be entitled to make a written submission to the Privacy Commissioner in your jurisdiction.

This Privacy Policy does not create or confer upon any individual any rights, or impose upon NAL any obligations outside of, or in addition to, any rights or obligations imposed by Canada's federal and provincial privacy laws, as applicable. Should there be, in a specific case, any inconsistency between this Privacy Policy and Canada's federal and provincial privacy laws, as applicable, this Privacy Policy shall be interpreted, in respect of that case, to give effect to, and comply with, such privacy laws.

# FOR RESIDENTS OF CALIFORNIA

**If you are a resident of California, this notice applies to you and supplements the *COMPANY* Privacy Policy. This notice is intended to provide certain information to you as required by the California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 (“CCPA”).**

This notice applies to information that identifies, relates to, describes, is capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked, directly or indirectly, with you or your household such as your real name, alias, postal address, unique personal identifier, online identifier Internet Protocol address, email address, account name, social security number, driver’s license number, passport number, or other similar identifiers (“personal information”). Personal information does not include publicly-available information and certain other information that is regulated by other applicable laws.

## Your Rights

### ***Right to Know***

You have the right to request that we disclose certain information to you about our collection of your personal information. Such information shall cover the 12-month period preceding our receipt of your request. Upon our receipt of your verified request, we will provide you with the following:

- The categories of personal information we have collected about you
- The categories of sources from which we have collected your personal information
- Our business or commercial purpose(s) for collecting or selling your personal information
- The categories of third parties with whom we have shared your personal information; and
- The specific pieces of personal information we have collected about you

You have the right to request that we disclose certain information to you about our disclosures of your personal information. Such information shall cover the 12-month period preceding our receipt of your request. Upon our receipt of your verified request, we will provide you with the following:

- The categories of personal information we have collected from you
- The categories of personal information that we disclosed about you for a business purpose

### ***Right to Delete***

You have the right at any time to request that we delete your personal information. However, in some cases we cannot delete all or some of your personal information as required or permitted by applicable laws.

### ***Right to Non-Discrimination***

We will not discriminate against you for exercising your rights under the CCPA, such as denying you products and services, charging you different rates or prices including use of discounts or penalties, or suggesting or providing a different level of service or quality of products to you. However, we may charge a different price or provide a different level or quality of products and services only if the price or difference is directly related to the value provided to you by your personal information.

We may offer you financial incentives, including payments to you as compensation, for collecting, selling, or deleting your personal information. We also may offer a different price, rate, level, or quality

of goods or services to the consumer if that price or difference is directly related to the value provided to you by your personal information.

We endeavor to respond to your request as soon as we can. If we are not able to respond to your request within 45 days, we will let you know that we may require additional time (up to 90 total days).

You may also use an authorized agent to exercise your rights on your behalf. If you wish to use an authorized agent, we require that your authorized agent provides written proof to us that he or she is authorized to act on your behalf, and we may also require your authorized agent to verify his or her own identity. We are not able to respond to more than one "Right to Know" request from a consumer in any 12-month period.

## Information We Collect

*Information we collect may include one or more of the following:*

- **Identifiers** (e.g. real name, address, social security number)
- **Characteristics of protected classification under California or Federal law;**
- **Commercial information** (e.g. location and historical data concerning surface leases, mineral rights, history of ownership, history of communication regarding our business relationship and directly related information)

### **Our business purposes for collecting this information;**

We collect and process your personal data for the purposes of logging our communications with our partners, consultants and other associated persons, and for relationship management and, in particular to:

- establish your identity and maintain our business relationship
- manage our relationship with you;
- manage our risks and help identify and investigate illegal activity, such as fraud;
- contact you, for example if we suspect suspicious activity on your account or need to tell you something important;
- comply with our legal obligations and assist government and law enforcement agencies or regulators

***Third parties we share this information with:***

We will not sell your personal data to any third parties. We may share your data with third parties where we have a legitimate interest or legal reason for doing so. These include:

- service providers, for example custodians, brokers, unit registry services or correspondent banks;
- those to whom we outsource certain functions, for example, statement production, information technology support;
- brokers, agents and advisers and persons acting on your behalf, for example your legal counsel or accountant
- other financial institutions, for example so that we can process a claim for mistaken payment;
- auditors;
- government and law enforcement agencies or regulators; and
- entities established to help identify illegal activities and prevent fraud.

We will share personal information with our affiliates for certain business purposes, only if the law permits it. Please note that we do NOT give your personal information, without your consent, to any organization outside of our member companies, for the purpose of that organization marketing their own products or services directly to you.
